We partner with community centers located in communities with high educational needs to empower learners with foundational skills through literacy and numeracy interventions.

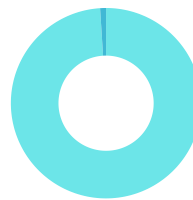

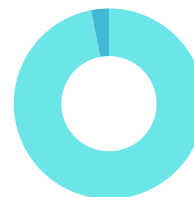

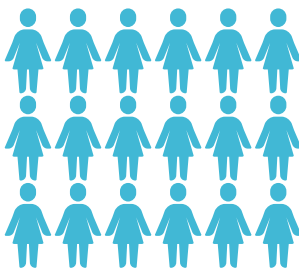

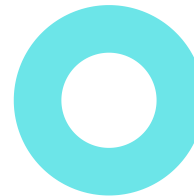

IN THE COMMUNITY

OBUNGA ESTATE

Obunga is a slum estate served by only one public school. Most learners are left behind due to crowding in the schools and poverty at home.

SomaSawa program partners with parents during holidays to provide innovative interventions in literacy and numeracy. 88% of learners enrolled each holiday finished their level of learning and progressed to the next higher level. Music was introduced as an extracurricular activity. Learners in the choir have improved in their music and social skills.

ALENDU COMMUNITY CENTER

Alendu community Center serves students in rural village of Alendu, HomaBay County. SomaSawa program partners with parents during holidays to provide innovative interventions in literacy and numeracy. 94% of learners enrolled each holiday finished their level of learning and progressed to the next higher level.

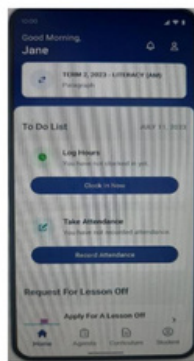
Innovative Interventions

STORIES OF US!

Here are a few stories that will give you a glimpse into our work and the relationships we build to change the destiny of our learners.



Teacher Godfrey

Kate was afraid that her friends would discover that she couldn't read. Teacher Godfrey was patient with her and gave her personal time to complete her intake assessment. Kate knew her teacher cared and was ready to help her. She relaxed and completed her assessment.

Kate's experience with the assessment made her excited and to look forward to the SomaSawa sessions. Over the 6-week period of the program, she arrived in class early and enjoyed every lesson. She participated in all her group activities. At the endline assessment, Kate was excited and couldn't wait to show off her reading and Math skills. She knew she had gained her new wings to fly in reading and math. She scored high and was promoted to the next level.

The SomaSawa program empowers teachers with innovative interventions that enable them to help learners close gaps in their learning. Learners' assessment happens on a one-to-one basis. Teachers have small groups of learners in each session. This enables them to support each learner at their level and no one is left behind. **Every day the teachers see the positive impact of the program as they work with learners like Kate!**

Mama Meriline Sewe

Meriline and her mother attended the 2022 dissemination event. Meriline Sewe is a third grade student at Okore Ogonda primary School. Before joining the SomaSawa program she was not able to read. After 3 terms of 6 weeks each, she reached the highest level of competency in reading and Math. She improved in her overall academic performance. She came from the bottom 5% of her class to the top 5%.

During the dissemination, Meriline shared her journey about SomaSawa lessons. With courage she talked about how she could now read the Bible at church and read story books to her friends at home. She dreams of becoming a doctor. Her mother shared her joy of seeing her daughter excel in her school within a short period of targeted support. "I am forever grateful for the SomaSawa program. May God bless their work to continue to help many more students in our community", said Mama Meriline. SomaSawa program engages parents in the program process and decisions. **Parents are the first stakeholders at the center of supporting their children.**



Oyola Learners: Innovation, Play, and Learning makes us happy

Learners at Oyola Primary School did not know what they signed up for. Madam Truphosa completed her training with SomaSawa. She was so excited by the new skills she had acquired. She purposed to wow her learners. In a school where more than 60% of the learners were not able to read or do basic Math, she took the challenge to change their school's story.

Madam Truphosa gathered all the students and strategically grouped them to make sure everyone benefitted from her class. The learners wondered why their class teacher was giving them a substitute. They looked from a far, but it only took 5 minutes, and they could not help it but jump into the fun of their new teacher's lesson. The entire class warmed up. The entire school could hear their voices. They were learning and having a great time. Students from other classes looked through the window, desiring to join in the lesson.

Each session, 30 implementation days, she graduated a group of students. At the end of the year, she had accomplished her goal of making sure all the learners in her school could read and do basic math. She became the new favorite teacher in their school. The end term exams in English and Math showed a big improvement. Overall performance in all subjects also improved.

The SomaSawa program innovative interventions shifts from schooling to learning for all. Its holistic learning through play, fun, real life stories and cultural context. All learners are given opportunities to engage at their level and supported to grow in every lesson. **Everyday our trained teachers and mentors see their learners grow in all life skills. Learners are at the center of program!**



Joyce

Joyce was the first mentor in the SomaSawa program. She set very high standards that have become the foundation of our work. “Being mentor is a gift that I did not ask for and I will treat it as gift that needs to be shared with all learners”, says Joyce.

SomaSawa mentors are trainers and mentors. They train teachers, support, and mentor them in the interventions as they facilitate in the classrooms. Empowering mentors is key foundational step in the success of our work. A great mentor is also a great team leader. “I love to see Joyce walk into our school. She always brings to us good news and encouragement. At times we have bad days but when Joyce shows up, things get better. She has a way of bringing us together, showing us a way forward and encouraging us to stay focused on the mission. When you follow her footsteps, you can be assured that the learners will gain a lot,” says teacher Davidson.

Joyce concludes by saying “we are the glue, we are the bridge, and we are a cornerstone. If we don’t train and mentor the teachers right, the learners will not gain. If we don’t build the right relationships with MoE and TSC, it will all crumble. **So, we stay focused and do our best daily.**”



Dr. Rugut, TSC Kisumu County Director

“We in Kisumu County are fortunate to have SomaSawa support in our schools. When they first came to my office, I was not sure if they would deliver but after they presented to us their interventions, I immediately knew we were in the right hands”, Dr. Rugut. Dr. Rugut was passionate about the SomaSawa program. He understood that empowering teachers was the only way to end the cycle of illiteracy and failure in the Kisumu County and national schools. He attended the trainings with the teachers so he could understand how to hold the teachers accountable. He gave us a point person in his team to coordinate all activities that involved teachers.

The SomaSawa program depends on Ministry of Education and Teachers Service Commission to partner with us to be able to reach teachers and learners. These partnerships ensure program quality and relevance.

Frequently MoE Quality Assurance Officers and TSC Curriculum Support Officers visit SomaSawa trained teachers to support them and supervise their work. They are a core part of the learners’ success. Like Dr Rugut, all our MoE and TSC partners are passionate and committed to the success of the learners. **SomaSawa program enjoys a vibrant relationship with our MoE and TSC partners. It’s our secret sauce!**

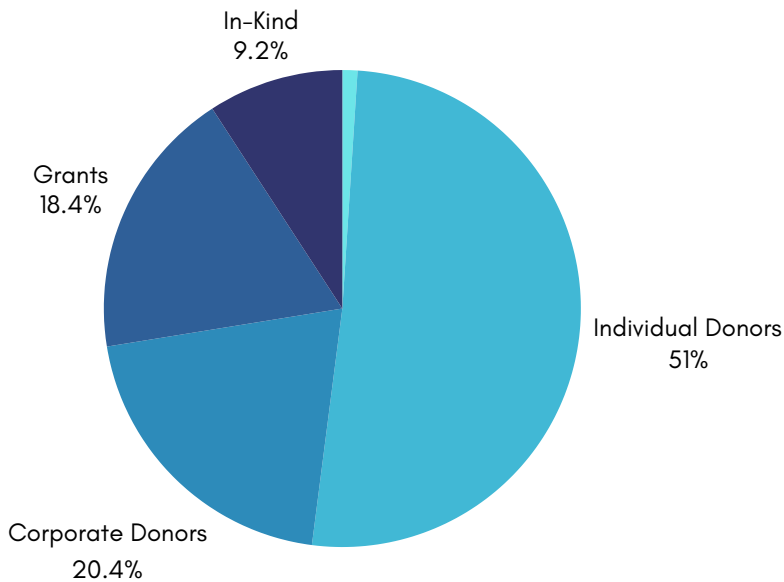

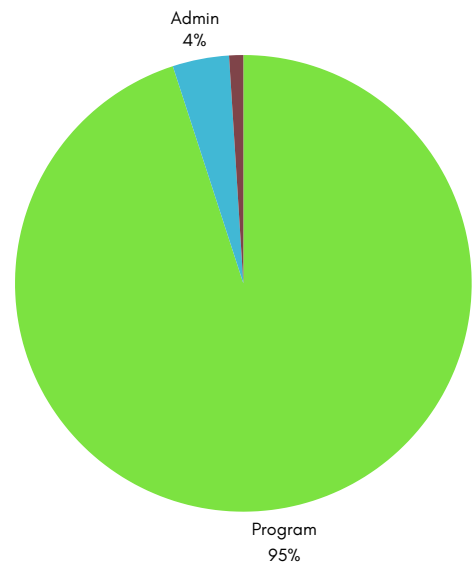
FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

WHAT'S AHEAD

- ★ In 2024, SomaSawa is launching its innovative technology application that will capture accurate real time data, improve lessons delivery, and support supervision. This application will enable us to reach thousands of learners in a much shorter time. In our inaugural year, we hope to serve 30 schools with approximately 12000 learners, with plans to reach over 120 schools in the next 3 years.
- ★ Reading is the core activity in our program. We are working with local authors to provide our learners with stories that are relevant to their lives, communities, and culture. The success of our program lies in strategic partnerships that ensure delivery of innovative interventions.
- ★ Raise \$80,000 in new donations.
- ★ And lastly in 2024 we will introduce a new comprehension and writing intervention. We target training at least 120 teachers in all 15 supported schools. This intervention will give learners who have graduated from the foundational intervention a new challenge to grow their reading, comprehension and writing skills.
